ZIP/CITY Monthly Update

July, 2017

Your July update of the ZIP/CITY System is enclosed.

The enclosed update contains the July, 2017 USPS city/state database information. It is valid until 10/31/2017. Please install this update as soon as possible.

Even though you are receiving monthly updates and there is considerable overlap in the expiration dates, we strongly encourage you to continue to install updates as soon as possible after they are received.

Fun Facts - Postal Service superlatives — everything you've ever wanted to know — and more.

Post Office Fun Facts

- **Most Common City Names** — Franklin is the most common city name with 31 locations. Clinton and Washington are second, with 29 each. Arlington is third with 28. Chester, Georgetown, Madison and Salem are next with 27 each. Then Fairfield, Greenville, Kingston, Marion, Riverside and Springfield all with 26 locations.
- **Most Common Street Names** — the five most common street names in the country are Main (by far the most common with nearly 13,000), 2nd, Maple, Oak, Park, 3rd and 1st — in that order — with more than 8,000 each.
- **Longest Main Street** — the longest Main Street in America is located in Island Park, ID (83429) and is 33 miles long.
- **Most Unusual Delivery Method** — Mule train delivery in AZ. Each mule carries about 130 pounds of mail, food, supplies and furniture down the 8-mile trail to the Havasupai Indians at the bottom of the Grand Canyon, averaging 4,000 pounds per day.
- **Another Unusual Delivery Method** — boat delivery on the Detroit River in Michigan. The JW Westcott is a 45-foot contract mail boat out of Detroit that delivers mail to passing ships. The JW Westcott has its own ZIP Code — 48222.
- **Another Unusual Delivery Method** — dock-to-dock delivery on the Magnolia River in Alabama. A 15-foot contract mail boat delivers to 176 dock-side mailboxes on a 31-mile stretch of the river.
- There are nearly 42,000 ZIP Codes in the country.
- The **lowest ZIP Code** is 00501, a unique ZIP Code for the Internal Revenue Service in Holtsville, NY.
- The **highest ZIP Code** is 99950 in Ketchikan, AK.
- The **easiest ZIP Code** to remember is 12345, a unique ZIP Code for General Electric in Schenectady, NY.
- The **longest rural delivery route** is in Mangum, OK. The carrier travels 182.75 miles daily and delivers to 248 boxes.
- The **shortest rural delivery route** is in Athens, GA. The carrier travels 0.18 miles daily and delivers to 280 central delivery boxes and one regular mailbox for a total of 281 deliveries.
- The Postal Service moves mail using planes, trains, trucks, cars, boats, ferries, helicopters, subways, float planes, hovercraft, mules, bicycles and feet.
- More than 657,000 tires were used on the postal fleet in 2016. If stretched end-to-end, these tires would span 145 miles.
- The Postal Service ordered more than 700 million rubber bands in 2016.

One new Zip Code was added for July. Seven existing Zip Codes were removed for July. A complete list of Zip Codes added and removed can be viewed by selecting option 1 from the ZIP/CITY Menu and pressing the F24 function key.

FIPS Code Updates

No new FIPS Codes were added or removed for July.

Area Code Updates

No new Telephone Area Codes were added or removed for July.

One new Telephone Area Code was added for June. Telephone area code 332 was added as an overlay for the Manhattan area of New York City. Telephone area code 332 covers the same geographical area as telephone area codes 212, 646, and 917.

CD-ROM's

This is a reminder about CD-ROM's. The CD-ROM's we send to you become your property. We do not expect you to return any of them to us.

You should always retain the current and the prior update, but after that, they can be disposed of in any manner you deem proper.

To install an update of the ZIP/CITY System do the following:

1. Sign on as any user with *ALLOBJ special authority.
2. Have all users sign off the ZIP/CITY System library. The ZIP/CITY System must not be in use during the new release installation. QTEMP should be in your library list.
3. Load the ZIP/CITY System CD-ROM.
4. Key LODRUN DEV(device name)
5. You will be asked to select the load method: Interactive or Batch.
6. If you select batch, you will be prompted for the start time. When the update ends, you will receive a message telling you that the installation has completed.
7. If you select interactive, upon completion of the installation, the ZIP/CITY System main menu will be displayed.
8. The new version number is **Z.17.07**
